It is essential for all divers to follow the safety precautions in order to enjoy scuba diving, and to plan your diving activity well in advance. Some of the aspects of your planning should include:

* Know the Scuba Diving Site Well

The first and foremost thing to do is to gather maximum information about the site where you intend to go for your dive trip. You can gather a wealth of information about the sites from the Internet. The information that you need to know is the current conditions, the tides and hazards for diving.

In addition to knowing the topography of the sites you should be aware of the hazards the sites are likely to pose. This can be anything from an abrupt change in conditions (i.e. direction of currents) to native poisonous fish and other marine life. This knowledge will help you to be prepared for emergencies in the unlikely event they occur.

* Know Your Capabilities

It is best to remain within the limits of your own certification. In case you wish to dive further, or expand your skills, it is advised you do an advanced diver training course. The course will help you to further your knowledge for diving deeper, navigation skills, and buoyancy control. It also involves additional expenditure in terms of time and money. If you are already an Advance Open Water diver you can take Specialty classes that will provide you with a more in depth look at the practices of wreck diving, digital underwater photography, search and recovery, night diving, or fine tune your navigation skills.

* Well Fitting Wet Suit for Scuba

Another factor that will make your scuba diving trip successful is your Wet Suit. A well fitted scuba suit containing panels of spandex and titanium fibers will give you adequate insulation and flexibility. Besides giving you protection it will also give you buoyancy. It is very essential to have a properly fitted suit. For the colder waters of California a 7mm suit is the most commonly used. In the winter months hooded vests are typically worn as well to increase warmth.

* Prepare Your Gear

Maintaining your diving gear properly is a must. The regulators, gauges and other pieces of equipment tend to gather salt crystals. After the day's diving all gear should be rinsed thoroughly in fresh water to prevent corrosion and damage to the gear. It is recommended that you have your regulator and your BCD serviced annually. Regular maintenance of equipment will help you in the long run when planning your next scuba diving trip!
